

Hebrews 11:7; 1 Peter 3:20)? (4.) Did that make the ark and water the savior?

Our next example in the chart is the **Israelites**. They were in Egyptian slavery. Please read Exodus 14. In the account “slavery” serves as a type of sin. It symbolizes or typifies sin. In order to be freed from slavery (type of sin) they had to be baptized, i.e., cross the Red Sea (cp. **1 Corinthians 10:1,2**). Before they crossed the Red Sea they were “sore afraid” (Exodus 14:10). After they crossed the sea they rejoiced (Exodus 15:1ff). It is significant to note that in water baptism, the rejoicing came after baptism because this is when people are saved from their sins (Acts 8:39; 16:34 cp. 2:38; 22:16; 1 Peter 3:21; Mark 16:16). If people are saved from sin before baptism, the rejoicing would come before baptism, but in the Bible it never does because people are saved in baptism. Paul is a good example. Before his baptism he was most miserable (read the account, Acts 9:1-20). Even though he believed and trusted Jesus at this point, he knew he was yet lost in his sins (cp. Acts 22:16). Questions: (1.) What if the Israelites had not obeyed and crossed through the sea? (2.) Were they saved before their baptism (crossing the sea)? (3.) Were the Israelites or Paul saved by “faith only”?

In 2 Kings 5 we read of a leper named **Naaman**. Elisha, the true prophet of God, told him what to do: “Go and wash in Jordan seven times, and thy flesh shall come to thee, and thou shalt be clean” (v.10). At first Naaman did not believe God’s Word on this matter, he “thought” it should be done a different way so he “went away in a rage” (v.11,12). Multitudes today are “thinking” up their own way of salvation and twisting Scriptures when they need to be hearing God’s Word on the matter. Finally, Naaman’s servants convinced him to do as the prophet said. At this point he believed (trusted). We know this because he “went” and “dipped” (v.14). Questions: (1.) Was Naaman saved from his leprosy (a type of sin) at the point of “faith only”? (2.) Or was he saved when he obeyed? (3.) What if Naaman never dipped, as God through the prophet instructed him to do, would he have been freed from his leprosy? (4.) What if Naaman had dipped in Abana or Pharpar, would he have been healed?

Concerning salvation, the Bible is right, but many men pervert the truth and teach something totally different (cp. Galatians 1:6-9; 1 John 4:1; 2 Peter 2:1-3). You have a choice, believe men or God.

The **conversion accounts**, of which some are listed in the chart, are very plain and show what people did and still must do in order to be saved from sin. The commands behind these examples are very plain and there will be no excuse for not obeying the gospel (cp. Acts 17:30; 2 Thessalonians 1:8,9). You can see in the chart (included) that the people were saved from their sins upon obeying the Savior’s Words (cp. Hebrew 5:9; Mark 16:15,16). This plan of salvation will last until the world ends (Matthew 28:18-20).
