Greetings from Natchez, MS. We have had a lot of rainy days, but it has been a very good and encouraging month. The church here has been so appreciative of us being here and the door knocking has been going very well even though the houses are far between. We much prefer walking from house to house, but here we have not been able to do that much. It is also hard on the car with all the stopping and backing up, etc.

There is so much work to do here as I have said of other places. The congregation is small and made up of older members. One member, right away, got us connected with two Baptist ladies for a study. After the first study and on the way home, one of the Baptists called the member and told her how impressed she was with the study. Sandy and I set up a Bible study with a Pentecostal while door knocking. We have had one study with her, but the next study is on hold while her husband undergoes heart surgery. The church here has not done any door knocking for around 20 some years nor had they been doing BCCs. So far (Jan.) we have signed up 13 for the BCCs and the preacher here is taking care of them.

We got a BCC sign up from Custer, SD after all this time (we worked there last summer). This shows the material can stay in people's homes for months and even years. We have seen this before several times. Another one signed up for the BCC from my website. He lives in Indiana.

Please note our change of address above and make changes to your records if you have not yet done so. One good brother asked "did you move to Texas, and then to Mt. Pleasant, or is the TN address a relative? Just wondering." Well, I am glad he asked as it shows me that I should explain our situation. I did not know these things either until we became full-timers (live in a RV full time) and Sandy and I did a lot of researching. There are about 100,000+ full-timers in the USA and some states are friendlier (benefits) to full-timers than other states and that is partly why we chose Texas to start with. Some are even friendlier. There is an excellent mail service at Livingston, TX for full-timers which we used and was a big reason we chose TX to start with. While residence of Texas, we spent very little time there, but we were fully set up there with health insurance, auto tags, etc. And we voted there by absentee ballot. I was summoned to jury duty twice and Sandy once. We always received the notifications after the date to appear because our mail goes to the mail service first then onto wherever we are. The first time I received one it scared me because I was supposed to have been there "yesterday" and they can fine you several hundred dollars. I called and explained our situation (full-timers) and the lady said that was fine and that they understood about the full-timers.

We are now fully set up in Tennessee and even more so than we were in TX. We have regular doctors in TN that we go to once a year. This we did not have before. Our daughter Tammy, who lives in TN, is handling our mail and that makes it much better. We hope to go to TN for Christmas each year to get together with both our daughters and their families. Some years this may be the only time we see both our daughters. Our youngest daughter Amy lives in WV. The bottom line is: we live where we are, but the government requires everyone to have an address so they can get your money!

As stated above the church here is very appreciative of us being here. We are very appreciative of you all making it possible for us to be here to door knock, pass out good sound material and to encourage the church by the work we do. Thank you all and may God bless you.
