**Greetings** to you all and we hope each and every one has a very happy holiday and a good New Year. We are looking forward to being with our children and grandchildren for the holidays and are especially anxious to meet our new granddaughter that is to come around Dec. 25<sup>th</sup>. Please pray that everything will be fine.

We are looking forward to **Amy** coming here to Elkin for a couple of days and being with us. We cherish each moment we get with our girls because our time together is so few.

**Brothers and sisters in Christ and congregations alike**, we want you to know that **we appreciate you** very much. We are thankful for your interest in evangelization. The good sound material that we pass out is made possible by you. The people we talk with and give a friendly invitation to the services of the church, and the ones offered the BCCs and take it are all made possible by you. I am convinced that in many places we have gone, even where the church exists, the people of the area have received the best opportunity they have had in a long time to learn and obey the truth. All the congregations we have helped have showed their appreciation to us – some individuals have done so more than others. We appreciate this and we always remind them that it is **because of you all** that we are able to do this work.

**Pat, the preacher here, had a heart attack** a few days ago but is doing well. He has Wagoner's disease and almost died a couple of years ago. The doctor said the heart attack was due to the disease. He is on medication and the doctor thinks this should take care of one of the clogged arteries. They did put one stint in. Please remember him in your prayers. I taught and preached in his absence and will preach our last Sunday here. We started the Sunday evening services when the folks from Ohio arrived and I have been teaching it as Pat does not drive here for that. They often talk about how they will miss us when we leave. Another member said it had been almost twenty years since she had been to Sunday evening services here and she was glad to be able to attend. Pat only comes on Sunday morning, and now on Wednesday evening for the six months that the couple from Ohio is here.

**It will be hard for Sandy to leave her sister.** It has been a blessing for Joyce, and her children, for Sandy to be here and to help out as much as she has. It has been good for Sandy also to be able to help. We are thankful that as we traveled through here the church asked us to stay and help them some – perhaps by providence of God. The chemo that Joyce takes makes her extremely weak. The doctor said he had never seen anyone react in such a negative way from the treatments as she has. It seems she has almost every bad side effect there is. Now, she has diabetes (caused by the chemo) and had to be hospitalized last week due to her blood sugar being so high. Sandy took Joyce to chemo the other day to give the daughter a break. Sandy has been helping with housework, laundry, etc. but the main thing that seems to help the most is just visiting with Joyce and having time with her. They will not know the results of whether or not this 3<sup>rd</sup> type of chemo is helping until toward the end of December. Please remember Joyce in your prayers, and Sandy also.
