**Greetings** to all and we hope each and every one of you are in good health and having a great day. We finished up our work in Mt. Pleasant and left Tammy's place on April 16<sup>th</sup> with a tearful good-bye. It is always hard to leave the girls but especially now with the new grandbaby. Babies change so quickly and are small for such a short time. We have been able to "Skype" with them twice since we've left. Felice looked at their computer and smiled and waved her arms but after awhile, looked a little concerned. I guess she was wondering why Granny and I didn't pick her up. We are so thankful for technology such as this.

On our way out to Winslow we stopped by a congregation in Albuquerque, NM. They had a nice big building but only about a dozen people meeting there. This is the only congregation on that side of town. Many who once attended here left and went to larger congregations. They are without a preacher so they asked me to speak Sunday evening.

One day of our travels we went from 81 degrees to 44 the next day due to a cold front. Luckily the heavy rains hit during the night. A couple of days later, the wind blew hard but not nearly as bad as when we were out this way two years ago. We did stop traveling that day earlier than normal because of the wind – I was tired of fighting it. The wind blows a lot in this part of the world. Sandy had talked with the campground host a few days before we arrived, and he said they had 104 mile wind just down the road about 6 miles away one day. Interstate 40 was closed around Winslow due to the dust storms caused by the wind. Tornadoes were also scattered about ahead of us and mostly north of us. Again, we are very thankful we missed all of this.

We are so thankful for the good trip we had out here. The only incident we had was a nail in the car's tire and thankfully I saw it in time before it got too low of pressure which causes overheating and likely a blow out. We had stayed in a Walmart parking lot and a tire repair center was only a quarter of a mile away. They took us right on in and we were soon on our way.

I was sick just before we left TN and Sandy got sick on the way out here with sinus problems. We both are much better but still having some trouble with our noses. I am still having some trouble with my throat and with coughing.

We started door knocking here on the 28<sup>th</sup>. The temperature was 93. As I mentioned before, we cannot leave the material on their door, they have to accept it. On this day, we knocked 51 doors only being able to hand out 14 packets. This is quite different than any other place we have worked. We also have to work around high winds. We have made some good contacts that I hope the preacher will follow up on – we gave him the info.

I am going to be preaching and teaching quite regularly. The preacher here is glad to have a little break. He is involved in a lot of outreach for young people and also in doing extra studies for any who will come.
