Whither We Goest, Thou Goest: By Your Prayers And Financial Support

Greetings to you all. Well we did it again, got caught in rainy, windy, cold weather up north, but we are trying to finish up Pinckneyville. We hope all is well with the church there, and we wish each of you a **happy Thanksgiving**.

Pinckneyville has a population of 5,500+ and no church of Christ. We have never seen so many "no soliciting" signs in a town. We do not go to these doors. Even though we do the same amount of walking, we aren't able to pass out as many packets. We did happen to knock on one of these doors (we didn't see the sign) and the lady signed up for the correspondence course. For October we passed out a total of 464 packets.

There are many sizable towns without the church in IL: Murphysboro 8,000 (about 25 miles from Pinckneyville); Pinckneyville 5,500; Sparta 3,400. This is just a few places of the larger towns, plus there are many smaller towns. I suppose one could work up here for many years and not run out of folks who may never have had a good opportunity to learn the truth.

A **policeman** stopped and wanted to know what we were doing. I told him and gave him a packet of our material. He wasn't very friendly but said as long as we weren't trying to sell something or asking for money, we were okay. I had a good chuckle that same day: **Sandy fell** alongside the road because she stepped in a hole. Ha, did you think I laughed at Sandy? Actually after I found out she wasn't hurt much and we walked on our way I thought of Peter not sinking on the water as he kept his eyes on Jesus. You see, Sandy was looking at me when she fell, I hope she learned her lesson.

The preacher, George Marshall, at the Christopher congregation helped us door knock one day and he is quite excited about the prospects of having a **tent meeting** here next spring and helping us. We appreciate his good lessons and willingness to help. We are praying that all things will work out so we can indeed have the tent meeting. One congregation and 2 individuals have donated money towards the purchase of the tent. If you can help, please donate soon. We will need money for rent of space, likely rent for chairs, newspaper ads, etc.

Dealing with error and those who hold it is always an unpleasant task. At another congregation we attended the teacher was saying that 1 Cor. 16:1,2 is not binding on us today. I politely disagreed with the error and so did another member, but the teacher just made light of it. He and I have exchanged several emails and in the exchange it came out that he also believes that everything we do in life is worship. Both are very serious errors and the latter opens the door for any and everything to be done in worship. It is very stressful to be in these situations and especially since we are the outsiders, but if we are going to be faithful, **we all have to stand for truth.**

Further proof that the tracts can stay in people's homes for long periods of time: We received a new Bible correspondence course from a lady in Louisville, MS. We were there in November '13 and April '14 so the material has been in her house several months to a year depending on when she got the packet. Of course we knew, from prior experience, that printed material can stay in people's homes a long time. When we were in Shenandoah, we had one lady to turn in a BCC lesson after 3 years.

Please continue your prayers for us and those many we have given packets to. **We thank you again** for your continued support of us whether monetarily or by prayers.
