Whither We Goest, Thou Goest: By Your Prayers And Financial Support



Greetings to all of you from your co-workers in the kingdom. Paul said, "And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which also ye are called in one body; and **be ye thankful**" (Col. 3:15). As God's people we have much for which to be thankful, and we should be thankful for all blessings. Paul further said, "First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for you all, that your faith is spoken of throughout the whole world" (Rom. 1:8). Even though we thank you in this report every month, we want to give you a special thank you and let you know that we truly appreciate you all. Not only for those who support this work financially and even by prayers – for which we are truly grateful, but for your faith and good works (please see article in SW).

We are thankful for our sponsoring congregation and its eldership. Having been there recently I was impressed and believe they truly are seeking to do all things God's way. I believe it is very important to have this mindset. We are thankful for the Mars Hill congregation which print two brochures for us; receive the thousands of other tracts; assemble them very neatly, and ship them to us as needed. We are thankful for those who support the work financially. Certainly we could not do this work without the funds. It does cost a little money to leave the material at each household we go to. The price is about 50 to 60 cents for each packet of tracts. Trying to be good stewards, we order the tracts in volume when we can in order to get better rates. When we are able, we order 10,000 of each tract and that saves money. We could save even more by ordering 25,000 at a time of each tract. **By doing so we could save about \$634.00 per individual tract order.** But we must have the money on hand to do this. We will be ordering more tracts soon, so if you can help us do so and order the higher volume to get the savings it would be greatly appreciated. We greatly appreciate your prayers.

Some results of what you are doing through your support and prayers for us: More good news from Louisville, MS. Ken emailed in part, "*The good news is that I baptized Jimmy ... last Wednesday night. I believe he is going to be a good member. He had to work Sunday morning but was present on Sunday evening. He seems very interested.*" Ken said Jimmy came home from work and found the packet of tracts on his door. He began reading it and the rest is the kind of history we like to hear! Also, we got an email concerning our work in Cave Springs, GA (214 packets): "*Received a phone call from an elderly lady (86). Was not in at the time. She left a message saying she has lived in Cave Springs for a number of years and that this was the first time a 'church' has ever left something at her door. I pray she calls again. Brotherly, Ed.*"

Our present work in Centre, AL (148 packets) is somewhat difficult as in other places we have been; the houses are scattered and we often feel like we are "beating the bushes" looking for a house. The bad weather has also been a hindrance. We have had some encouraging news: just a few days after we started the work in Centre, one turned in my correspondence course that we have in the packet of material and he also requested the DVD. I have given his information to the preacher here and he is handling it.

The power is in the Word of God (Rom. 1:16). We must keep on getting the Word before the people, by every means possible. And we want to express our gratitude to each of you who pray for this work and support it financially. You are what keeps us going. We pray God's many blessings on each of you.
